Medical Forms

The new Annual Health and Medical Record Part A, B, and C with Part B signed by a physician covers everyone and is the recommended form. Technically, the old Class 1 and Class 2 can be used for all Scouts and adults under 40, but the Class 1 must be new this year and the Class 2 must be signed by a physician. Those forms will no longer be used after January 1, so you might as well use the new forms now.

Camp Fees

Camp fee is \$225 if paid by May 26 (last meeting before May 29). Cost will be \$255 if paid after May 26.

Medications

Prescription drugs must be kept locked up in camp by either the CSR Health Lodge or a Troop 57 adult. Adults will dispense prescription drugs as needed and a log will be kept. The prescription drugs must be in their original containers.

Spending Money

About \$30 -\$50, some merit badges may require an additional \$5 to \$20 for supplies. Ranger (New Scout) program needs \$15 for program materials and hiking stick. COPE costs \$35. Golf MB cost \$25. The Trading Post has snacks, ice cream, drinks, t-shirts, caps, etc.
